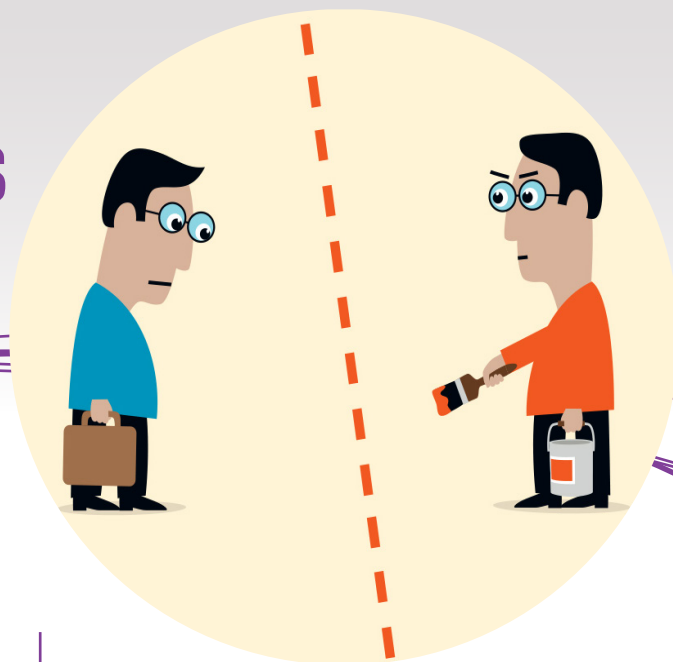


Understanding Professional Boundaries

Dr. Finney is a board certified clinical psychologist and clinical associate professor and focuses on mental health in military and police officers. A retired U.S. Air Force officer, Finney's final assignment was flight commander of the mental health clinic at Los Angeles Air Force Base, where she was responsible for the delivery of mental health services, family advocacy and substance abuse services to the 8,300 beneficiaries served by the clinic. Following several assignments as an Air Force psychologist, she was selected Field Grade Psychologist of the Year for 2003 by Air Force Space Command. In 2004, she received a fellowship in psychopharmacology and later earned her post-doctoral master's degree in psychopharmacology from Nova Southeastern University. Over the course of her service, Finney has served as director of mental health services, a flight commander and Air Force Space Command mental health consultant.
