# A Primer in Telehealth Services for Providers, Caregivers, & Individuals with Special Needs

This presentation will provide a brief overview of telehealth and its effectiveness, risk, benefits, and best practices. Potential uses of telehealth services and how to prepare for their use as a provider, caregiver, and end user will be introduced.
